THE MODEL VILLAGE.

The chief endeavour of the Hungarian Village Association (Budapest, V., Zoltán-utca 8.) aims at developing and enhancing the antique popular ornaments of the environment and strives to promote the wholesome, suitable and pretty way of building of villages.

We pointed with popular lectures and a series of articles at the faults of village building and we demonstrated the correct way of building from hygienic point of view in more than hundred exhibitions.

Encouraged at the results of our demonstrative advises, we presented in a 250 fold diminution, a whole village at the International Exhibition for Protection of human life,

held in Budapest from May till August 1926. in which model the streets, areas, dwelling-houses and public buildings are arranged and erected according to the requirements of hygiene, economy and facility of communication.

The model-village is not an utopia incapable of being carried out, as its details have been realised already in some or other Hungarian village, and all that we had to do was, to condense these details into one village which may thus be considered as the ideal village of the future.

We do not expect that based on our projects suddenly a whole new village will spring up, but in a few scores of years a village which realises something of the model, year after

public institutions where the population of the farms will find dissipation and instruction.

The plan of the model-village of the future was cast by architect Joseph László, on the basis of Dr. Anthony Bodor's university lectures.
